**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER FURTHER EXTENDING THE MODIFIED GENERAL
COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) IN THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL.**

WHEREAS, under Section 4 (g) of the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act, the Local Government Units, while mandated to act within the letter and spirit of all the rules, regulations and directives issued by the National Government and to implement standards of Community Quarantine consistent with what the National Government has laid down for the subject area, are however allowed to continue exercising their autonomy in all matters undefined by the National Government or are within the parameters it has set;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Governor of Bohol is empowered to issue executive orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement of laws and ordinances and to carry out such emergency measures during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities under Section 465 (b) (1) (vii) in relation to Section 465 (b) (2) (iii) of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the undersigned issued Executive Order No. 33, Series of 2020, of even date placing the entire Province of Bohol under a Modified General Community Quarantine from 01-15 July 2020 and further extended its effectivity until 31 July 2020 by virtue of Executive Order No. 38, Series of 2020;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 33, following the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines as amended on 25 June 2020 ("IATF Omnibus Guidelines") issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease ("IATF"), provides for a more relaxed and less stringent community quarantine but still imposing measures and protocols, such as but not limited to, sea and air travel ban, imposition of province-wide curfew and home quarantine, partial liquor ban, mandatory use of face masks, imposition of one-household-one-pass-policy, and the regulated operation of business establishments under the new normal in line with national standards;

WHEREAS, considering the declaration by the health authorities of a local or community transmission, there is a need to further extend the effectivity of Executive Order No. 33 placing the entire province under a state of Modified General Community Quarantine;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above premises, I, **ATTY. ARTHUR C. YAP**, Governor of the Province of Bohol, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the further extension of the effectivity of Executive Order No. 33, Series of 2020, which places the Province of Bohol under the state of a Modified

General Community Quarantine and providing guidelines thereof, from 12:01 A.M. of 01 August 2020 to 11:59 P.M. of 31 August 2020.



PROVIDED ALSO, that the operation of Bars, Nightclubs, KTV, Karaoke Joints, and Cinemas shall continue to be prohibited. Cockfighting, gambling, and betting activities shall continue to be strictly prohibited.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that Internet Cafes/Shops shall be allowed to open and operate on a fifty percent (50%) capacity basis and only for educational and work purposes. Online gaming and amusement purposes of Internet Cafes/Shops are still strictly prohibited. Internet Cafes/Shops shall obtain clearance from their respective City/Municipal Local Government Units showing they can adopt minimum health and safety protocols. The Philippine National Police, Municipal Business Licensing Offices and Barangay Officials shall strictly monitor compliance of the Internet Cafes/Shops of these health and safety protocols.

PROVIDED FINALLY, in line with the spirit of local autonomy and in the exercise of police power to protect public health and safety, City/Municipal Local Government Units are given the discretion and prerogative to regulate the operation of their public markets, such as but not limited to, imposing Market Coding and Clustering Scheme, prohibiting non-residents from selling and buying during their customary Market Days, and other measures to comply with strict social distancing measures as directed by the IATF in Par. 6, Section 8 of its Omnibus Guidelines.

However, City/Municipal Local Government Units are enjoined to ensure unhampered movement and delivery of all types of cargoes, goods, and commodities within and across their respective jurisdictions pursuant to Par. 1, Section 7 of the IATF Omnibus Guidelines.
