AN EXECUTIVE ORDER AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 33, SERIES OF 2020, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE GUIDELINES UNDER A STATE OF MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE IN THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL, AND FURTHER EXTENDING ITS EFFECTIVITY

WHEREAS, under Section 4 (g) of the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act, the Local Government Units, while mandated to act within the letter and spirit of all the rules, regulations and directives issued by the National Government and to implement standards of Community Quarantine consistent with what the National Government has laid down for the subject area, are however allowed to continue exercising their autonomy in all matters undefined by the National Government or are within the parameters it has set;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Governor of Bohol is empowered to issue executive orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement of laws and ordinances and to carry out such emergency measures during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities under Section 465 (b) (1) (vii) in relation to Section 465 (b) (2) (iii) of R.A. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the undersigned issued Executive Order No. 33, Series of 2020, of even date placing the entire Province of Bohol under a state of Modified General Community Quarantine from 01-15 July 2020, extended its effectivity until 31 July 2020 by virtue of Executive Order No. 38, series of 2020, and further extended the same from 01 August 2020 to 31 August 2020 by virtue of Executive Order No. 39, Series of 2020, extended during the entire month of September by virtue of Executive Order No. 46, Series of 2020, and extended from 01 October 2020 to 30 November 2020 by virtue of Executive Order No. 48, Series of 2020;


WHEREAS, Section 151 of the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines as amended on 15 October 2020 ("IATF Omnibus Guidelines") issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease ("IATF"), provides for the Guidelines for Areas Placed under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ).

WHEREAS, due to the changes in the Guidelines set forth by the IATF, particularly its Resolution No. 79 dated 15 October 2020, there is a need to harmonize our own MGCQ Guidelines under Executive Order No. 33, Series of 2020;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above premises, I, ATTY. ARTHUR C. YAP, Governor of the Province of Bohol, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby amend Executive Order No. 33, Series of 2020, which provides for the Guidelines under a state of Modified General Community

Quarantine in the Province of Bohol, and further extending its effectivity on **11:59 p.m. of 31 January 2021**, with the amended guidelines as follows:

SECTION 1. Limitations of Movement under Modified General Community Quarantine. The following are the limitations of movement of persons in the Province of Bohol in accordance with the IATF Guidelines issued on October 15, 2020, viz:

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- a. The movement of all persons in areas placed under MGCQ shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, for work in the offices or industries permitted to operate hereunder, and for other activities permitted under this Section. *(As amended by Paragraph A(4)(a) of IATF Resolution No. 43, June 03, 2020)*
 - b. The default province-wide curfew imposed from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. is hereby lifted.
 - c. The stay-home directive for persons below fifteen (15) years old and those who are over sixty-five (65) years old, shall remain to be the general rule. As an exception, minors below fifteen (15) years old may be allowed to go out of their residences on Fridays and Saturdays while those who are over sixty-five (65) years of age and above may be allowed to go out of their homes on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. However, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women shall be required to remain in their residences at all times; Provided that all activities and movements allowed under other Sections of these Guidelines for the foregoing persons shall continue to be permitted under MGCQ. *(As amended by Paragraph A(4)(b) of IATF Resolution No. 43, June 03, 2020, and Paragraph A of IATF Resolution No. 79, October 15, 2020)*
 - d. Indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise such as but not limited to walking, jogging, running, biking, golf, swimming, tennis, badminton, equestrian, range shooting, and skateboarding are allowed. *Provided*, that the minimum public health standards such as the wearing of masks and the maintenance of social distancing protocols, and no sharing of equipment where applicable, are observed. Spectators in all non-contact sports and exercises shall be prohibited. *(As amended by Paragraph A(4)(c) of IATF Resolution No. 43, June 03, 2020, and Paragraph B of IATF Resolution No. 56, July 16, 2020)*
 - e. Mass gatherings such as but not limited to, movie screenings, concerts, sporting events, and other entertainment activities, religious services, and work conferences shall be allowed provided that participants shall be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the seating or venue capacity. *(As amended by Paragraph A(4)(d) of IATF Resolution No. 43, June 03, 2020)*
 - f. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes may be conducted in HEIs provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, consultation with local government units, and compliance with guidelines set by CHED.
 - g. Face-to-face TVET training and competency assessment may be conducted at up to 50% training and assessment site capacity, provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, TESDA Guidelines and consultation with local government units.
 - h. For K-12 Basic Education, the Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan of the DepEd shall be adopted.
 - i. The province-wide partial liquor ban as provided under Executive Order No. 17, Series of 2020, is hereby lifted subject to the regulation of establishments serving liquor as provided by the guidelines issued by the

Department of Trade and Industry, Department of Tourism and/or the IATF.

SECTION 2. Permitted Work, Occupations, Industries, and Businesses. The following are the permitted work, occupations, industries, and businesses allowed within the Province of Bohol:

- a. Subject to existing rules, regulations, and issuances by relevant government agencies and the IATF, all establishments and businesses within the Province of Bohol shall be allowed to operate.

All establishments that are allowed to remain open shall strictly enforce physical distancing measures and other mandatory safety measures or public health standards.

- b. Dine-in in restaurants, fast food chains, and carenderias shall be allowed but limited to 50% of the establishment's total customer seating capacity, provided that they shall comply with all DTI Guidelines on Minimum Health Protocols for Restaurants and Fast Food Chains.
- c. The following establishments shall be allowed to operate at the following operational capacities:

* IT, communications, and electronic equipment 100%

* Flower, jewelry, novelty, antique, perfume shops 100%

* Toy store (with playgrounds and amusement area closed) 100%

* Music stores 100%

* Art galleries (selling only) 100%

* Firearms and ammunition trading establishment 100%

* Barbershops and Salons, *provided that they are compliant with DTI-issued protocols* 50-100%

All other public and private construction projects, subject to strict compliance to the issued construction safety guidelines for the implementation of infrastructure projects during the COVID-19 pandemic by the DPWH 100%

Gyms/Fitness studios and Sports Facilities

Outdoor and indoor sports, facilities for non-contact sports, and other forms of exercise. 50%

Internet and computer shops (subject to strict health protocols) – Only for Work or Educational Purposes ONLY 50%

Other education and educational support establishments such as but not limited to:

— testing centers, tutorial and review centers 50%

— language, driving, dance/acting/voice schools 50%

Kid amusement industries (e.g., playrooms, rides) 50%

Libraries, archives, museums and cultural centers 50%

Tourist destinations (e.g., water parks, beaches, resorts) 50%

Travel agencies, tour operators, reservation service and related activities 50%

Other personal care services (e.g., massage parlors, sauna, facial care, waxing, etc.) 50%

- d. Regular operating hours of banks and other financial institutions shall be observed.
- e. Work in government offices may return to full operational capacity at the discretion of the Local Chief Executive (LCE) or head of agency.
- f. Malls and shopping centers are allowed limited operations which shall comply faithfully with Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Memorandum Circular No. 20-21 s. 2020: *Guidelines on the Operations of Malls and Shopping Centers in Areas Declared under Modified General Community Quarantine*.
- g. Physical school classes shall continue to be suspended. The operation of schools shall faithfully comply with guidelines issued by the Department of Education and the Commission on Higher Education.
- h. Public land transportation shall operate at a reduced capacity in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and/or the Land Transportation Franchise and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) which includes, among others, the following:
 - (i) Physical distancing and limited passenger capacity as well as required sanitary measures shall be strictly observed.
 - (ii) Operation of public transport shall be allowed only in routes identified and approved by the DOTr and/or the LTFRB.
 - (iii) Passenger load limits, fares, special permit/s to operate, and other particulars of the service shall be regulated by the LTFRB.
 - (iv) Other modes of public land transport service (PUVs such as modern jeepneys, shuttle service, tourist transport service, school transport service) may be allowed to operate within the Province of Bohol as determined by the LTFRB thru a special permit.
 - (v) Component LGUs may allow the resumption of operations of tricycles-for-hire within their respective territorial jurisdictions subject to the following conditions:
 - (v.1) Tricycles are not allowed to ply the national highway and shall be limited to provincial and municipal roads.
 - (v.2) Tricycles may be allowed to transport passengers to designated stops where minibuses can pick them up.
 - (v.3) Only one (1) passenger shall be allowed per tricycle.
 - (v.4) Strict compliance of physical distancing measure and other guidelines from the DOTr and/or the Land Transportation Office.

SECTION 5. Repealing Clause - All Executive Orders and other issuances which are inconsistent herewith are deemed repealed and modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. Effectivity - This Order shall take effect on **12:01 of 16 November 2020 to 11:59 p.m. of 31 January 2021**, unless further extended or modified by a subsequent issuance.
